says Michelle. It’s important to count yourself in on your census form, wherever you live.



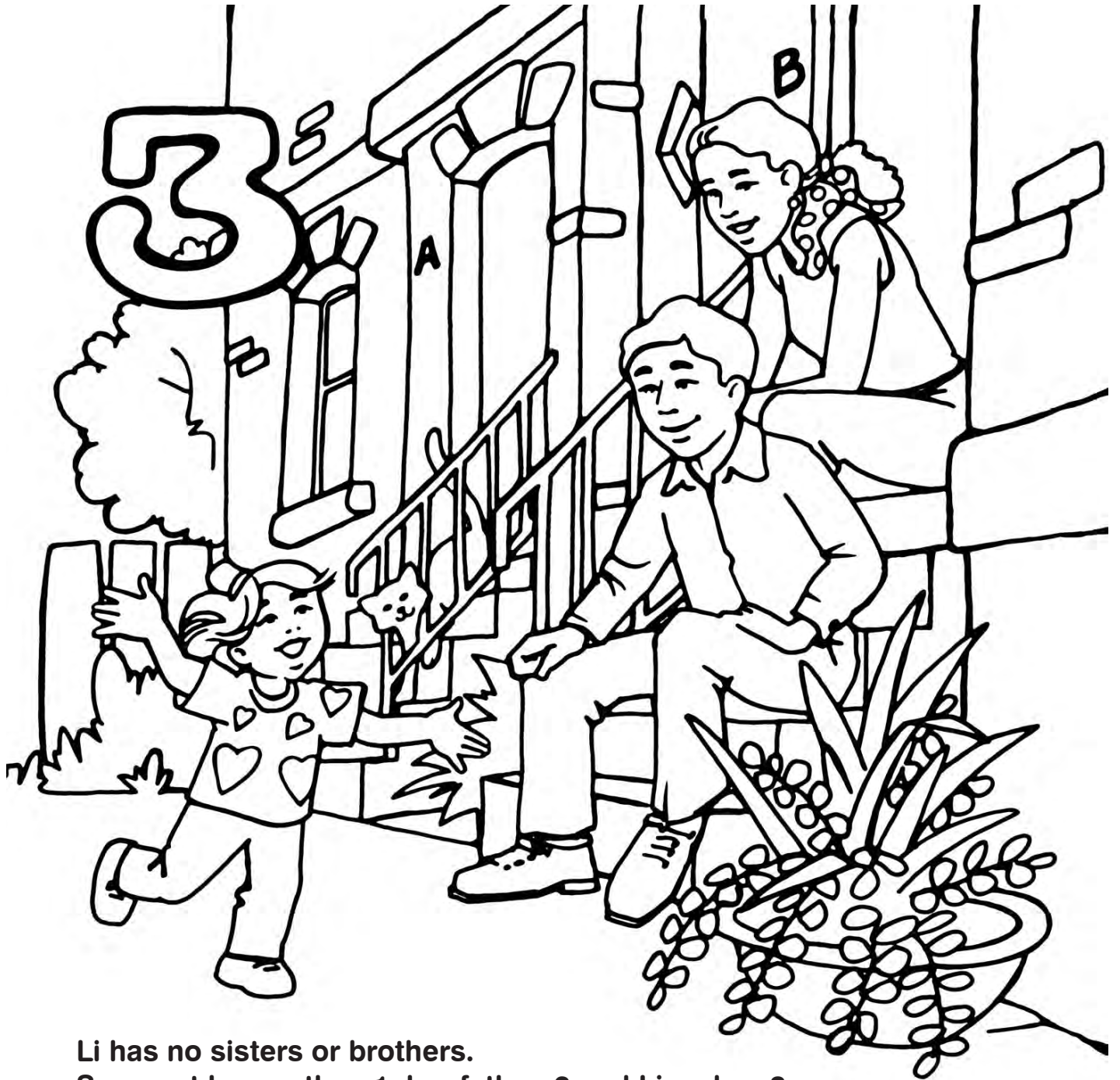


This is where Michelle's grandparents live. We don't count Michelle here. Count Grandfather, 1 and Grandmother, 2. There are 2 people who live in this home.

says Li to Felix, her friend in the park.

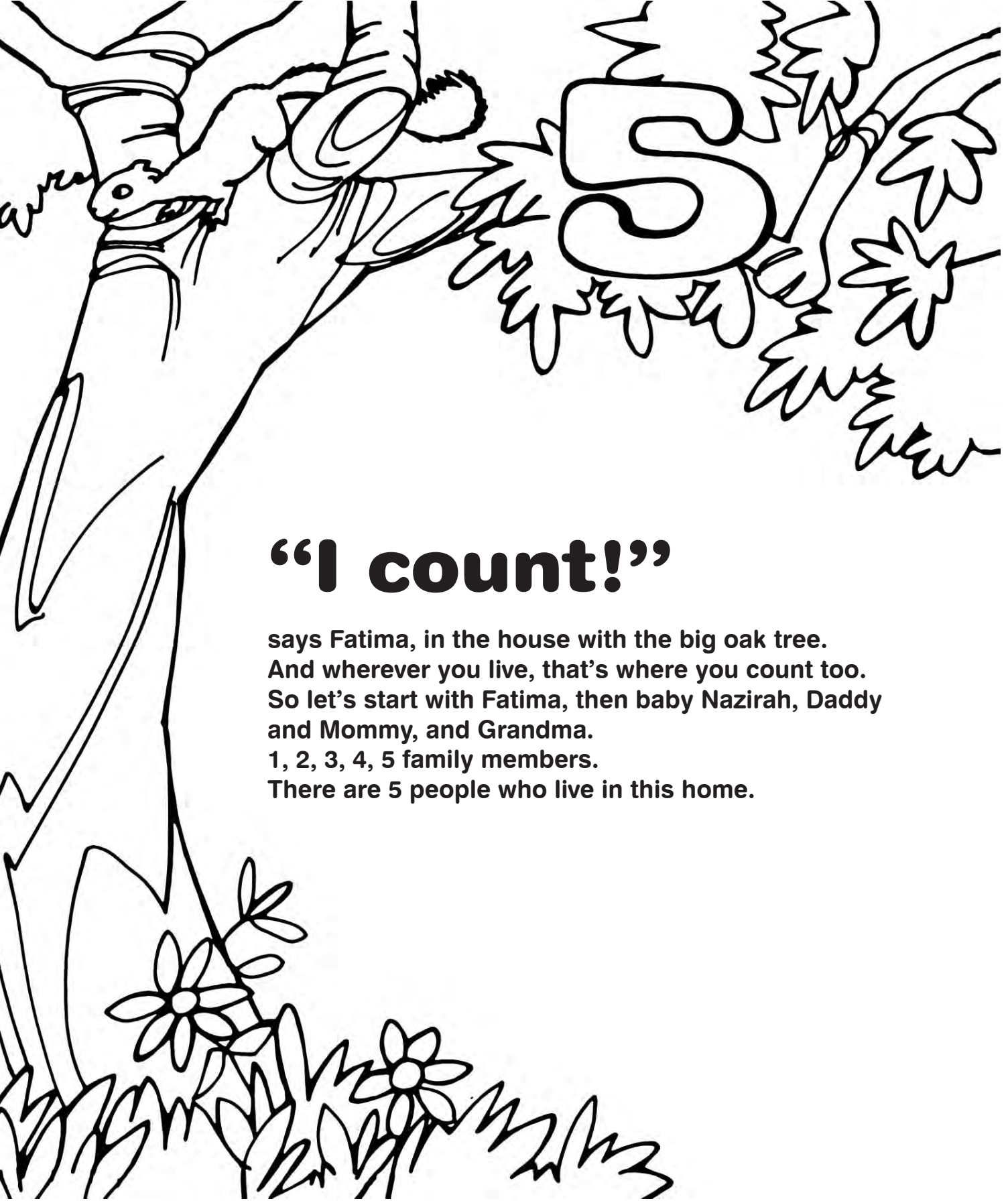
Felix lives with his sister Marie-Claire and her husband Jean.

There are 6 people who live in this home.









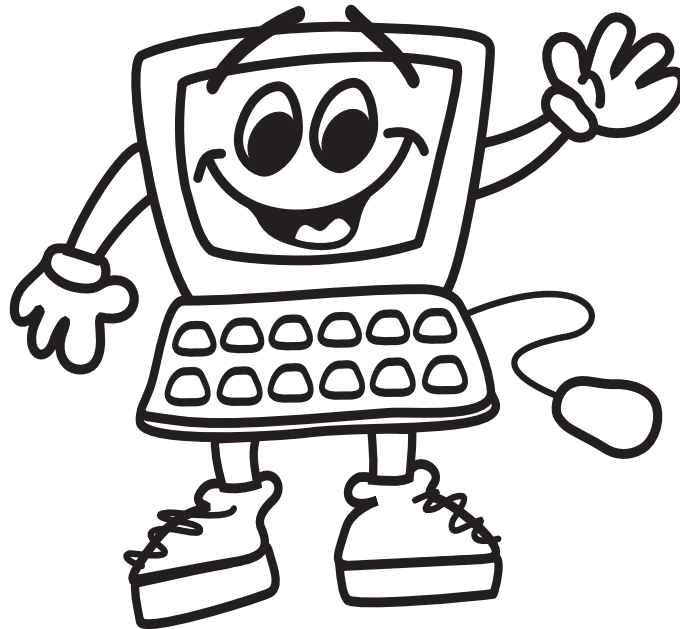
# “Your neighbours count too!”

and that includes you! Count all the children.

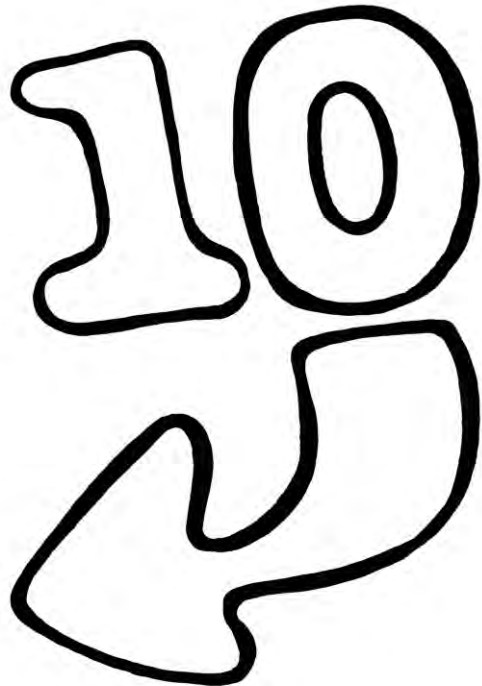
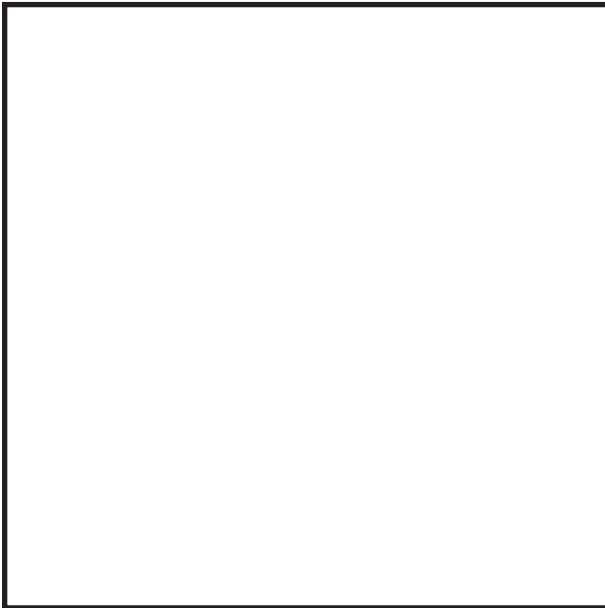
